

Gayla's Window Valance

Supply List

This valance works best when constructed out of a medium-weight decorative fabric. The swag sections, side horns and middle horn are lined in a contrasting fabric and piping is used for a professional edge finish and to prevent the lining from showing at the bottom of the treatment.

MATERIALS:

These amounts are for a valance measuring 40" to 42" finished, installed width (bracket to bracket measurement).

See chart for other widths. These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric. Not Recommended to use fabric needed to match pattern such as stripes, checked and certain patterned designs.

Fabrics:

- 1 ½ yards of decorative fabric for valance front*
- 1 ½ yards of contrasting fabric for lining *
- 1 ½ yard of contrasting fabric for piping or 5 yards of purchased piping*

Supplies:

- Sewing Machine in good working order
- Zipper Foot in addition to normal sewing foot
- Basic Sewing equipment including scissors, pins, measuring tape, seam gauge, etc.
- Wonder Clips (Can be purchased at All Brands w/class discount)
- Fabric chalk marker
- 5 yards of 4/32"-diameter cotton piping *
- 1" to 1 ½ " rings w/clips—Number depends on size of valance, which can be purchased after 1st class.

The following fabric requirements are based on the assumption that one treatment is being constructed. If multiple treatments are being constructed, fabric requirements could be less than shown below.

Window Width	Face fabric [†]	Draperies Lining	Contrasting fabric for lining, ls & piping	4/32" cotton piping
Up to 42"	1 ½ yds	¾ yd	2 ½ yds	5 yds
43" to 63"	2 yds	1 ½ yds	3 yds	7 yds
64 to 84"	2 ½ yds	1 ½ yds	3 ½ yds	9 yds
85 to 99"	3 yds	2 ¼ yds	4 yds	11 yds

** These amounts are based on 54" wide fabric.*

NOTE: Ignore yardage for Draperies Lining—We will not use for the window treatment taught in class. We will be showing various options that can use draperies lining, tabs, bands and covered buttons for future valances.
