

CATHEDRAL WINDOWS TABLE RUNNER SUPPLY LIST

Supplies can be purchased at All Brands at a 15% class discount

FABRIC:

- Fabric A: 1-1/4 yards quilting cotton (flower print in sample). If you plan to fussy cut to get a particular design centered, you will likely need more fabric.
- Fabric B: 1-1/4 yards quilting cotton (purple with gold spatter in sample)
- Flannel or Thin Batting: 1-1/4 yards
- Optional: small piece coordinating fabric for covered buttons (gold batik in sample)

IMPORTANT: Before class:

1. Pre-shrink all fabric (batting does not need to be pre-shrunk).
2. Cut fabrics and flannel/batting into 11" squares. 12 squares for each piece of fabric and flannel/batting.
3. Make twelve fabric stacks with a piece of flannel/batting sandwiched between a piece of Fabric A and Fabric B. The right sides of both Fabric A and B should be facing out.
4. If you have enough fabric, cut and make one extra stack to practice serging on a curve. If you do not have enough project fabric, choose any two quilting cottons from your stash to make a sandwich with flannel/batting in the center.

The templates needed to make the Cathedral Window blocks will be handed out in class. If you are centering a design on Fabric A, bring two pieces of plastic for the templates to be copied onto.

OTHER SUPPLIES:

- Serger in good working condition
- Regular, Curve, Clear Regular or Clear Curved presser foot. Note: A curve foot is great for serging circles.
- 4 spools serger thread.
 - Two spools serger thread that matches your fabric
 - Two spools should be heavier weight decorative thread. The sample was made with 12-weight Sulky thread.
- Five 7/8" or 1-1/4" self cover buttons
- Pattern weights are a plus. (A limited supply will be available in class for those that do not own weights.)
- Basic Supplies including:
 - Pins or Wonder Clips®
 - Fabric Scissors
 - Seam Ripper
 - Chalk or temporary marker
 - Fray Block™, Fray Check™ or other seam sealant
- Optional: small iron and ironing mat
